Today's Service

This morning's Service starts with the lighting of seven Candles of Remembrance. In the Call to Worship, we acknowledge our feelings of fear, pain, and loss. The hymn *Be Still, My Soul* reminds us of God's presence, and in our Prayer of Confession, we ask God to help us love as Christ loves. The Pastoral Prayer is a litany, asking God to hear, heal, guide, save, love, and go with us.

The Scripture readings are short, as is the sermon, where I draw parallels with the Easter story. It is a message of hope. We will sing *God Bless America* together, and then *Let There Be Peace on Earth* after the Benediction.

This is one of the most difficult services I have ever researched and written, going from remembrance to healing to peace. It has touched me spiritually; I hope it does the same for you.
