

## **Memories of My Mother**

Mildred "Millie" Bachmann was born in Brooklyn, NY, on September 7, 1927 to Christian John Rosenbauer and Anna Smith Rosenbauer. She was the youngest of four siblings, and remained in Brooklyn until marrying on her 20<sup>th</sup> birthday to Charles "Charlie" Bachmann.

She met my Dad when she was 14 years old, as he was friends with her older brother, John. Both my parents graduated from Grover Cleveland High School in Ridgewood. Mom went to work in a bank and my Dad went off to war. He landed in Normandy on the fourth day of the invasion, and helped to liberate Paris, but he never spoke to my brother and me about his wartime experience abroad.

Mom and Dad moved to Queens, and had fun as a couple with Arthur and Terry Geyer, who became their life-long best friends. I came along after they were married for six years. We moved to Commack, and my brother, Brian, was born the following year.

Mom found her second home here at The First Presbyterian Church of Greenlawn. My father had been raised Catholic, but my parents could not be married in a Catholic church because my mother did not wish to convert. My father left the Catholic church, but always retained his strong faith. I have happy memories of my father driving my brother and me to the playground near the church on Sunday mornings, and then to Sunday School.

My Mom has been a member of Greenlawn Presbyterian Church for over 60 years. When my Dad became ill in his later years, Pastor Fred Woodward would visit him in the hospital. After my Dad passed on in 2010, my Mom became more involved with the church, participating in Bible Studies and counting the offerings.

Mom had several serious hospitalizations in her later years, but always rallied due to her strong will and strong faith.

Pastor Ann Van Cleef visited my mother often at Sunrise Assisted Living in Holbrook, and they became very close. She also prayed with my Mom in the hospital.

Mildred was predeceased by her parents, her brothers, Robert and John, and her sister, Edie. She is survived by her daughter, Lynne Ward (Jeff), her son, Brian

(Donna); grandchildren, Timmy, Jaxson, Hudson, and LJ; and great-grandson, Rocco.

Mildred's family is very grateful for all the wonderful memories they have of this church and the loving persons they have met here.
