

Welcome, Rev. Mark Applewhite.

Rev. Mark Vernon Applewhite, ordained at Riverside (Rockefeller's Church Christ Chapel) as a graduate of Union Seminary of Columbia University in the city of New York, is formerly Moderator (1999-2001) of the United Church of Christ's Suffolk Association of Long Island, NY, which is all the UCC Churches of Eastern Long Island.

Riverside Church is the tallest church in the United States with the largest ringing-bell inthe-world. As Temporary Supply Pastor, Mark's last church was the Presbyterian Church of Center Moriches. Prior to that, Mark completed Princeton Seminary's training in Presbyterian "Transitional Ministry," 2019, the same year Rev. Applewhite served Presbyterian Church of Glen Cove. Presently, Mark, and his wife, Cathy (a retired Church Educator), live locally in E. Northport while Mark serves full-time as the Board Certified Chaplain of Huntington Hospital. Mark is the longest multi-faith Chaplain serving 3 major in-patient Hospitals on the eastern end of Long Island. Rev. Applewhite's ministry began at St. John's Episcopal Hospital in 1995 after Mark and Cathy completed Clinical Pastoral Education in Allentown, PA. We welcome Mark.

California Wildfires

On January 7 of this year, wildfire activity began in Los Angeles County, CA. Immediate reports indicate that this fire has caused substantial damage throughout LA County, making this event the largest fire disaster in the county's history. AT the time of this writing, nearly 30,000 acres have been consumed by the blazes. 189,999 people are currently displaced from their homes due to devastation or evacuation orders, and these fires continue to spread, causing additional destruction.

"Multiple churches have been impacted and multiple Presbyterians have lost their homes," said the Rev. Jim Kirk, Associate for National Disaster Response for <u>Presbyterian Disaster Assistance</u>.

As of this writing, an estimated 130,000 people have been under evacuation orders as the fires have ravaged communities, consuming about 42 square miles, which is almost as large as the entire city of San Francisco, according to the AP.

In addition to the Presbytery of the Pacific, the fires are also thought to have impacted the <u>San Fernando</u> and <u>San Gabriel</u> presbyteries, Worthen Gamble said.

"PDA is reaching out and has been in communication with the impacted presbyteries, offering support," Kirk said. "However, at this time, because it's still an ongoing disaster, it's not safe for people to come in. We pray for the hundreds of first responders who are working diligently and faithfully to keep people and property safe."

The Pacific Palisades Presbyterian Church, which is part of the Presbytery of the Pacific, was lost in the massive Palisades fire, the largest blaze at more than 17,000 acres. Fortunately, there were no lives lost.

In the midst of the emergency on Wednesday, the Rev. Juan Sarmiento, executive presbyter of the Presbytery of San Fernando, provided this glimpse into the situation. "Our home is under evacuation warning. No electricity or internet. Prayers for our family and wisdom on how to support the churches in the presbytery are appreciated."

"Pray for those who are in harm's way and the hundreds of firefighters who are risking their own well-being to keep people and property safe" in all areas, Kirk said.
